'Rhymes LIVE' is an energetic, eclectic, original musical show for families with young children that will get everyone dancing and singing!

We've been reimagining and reinventing the 'rhyme' for the modern-day family since 2015, with our original songs co-written with parents and young children in projects delivered across London with arts charity Creative Futures - as this 2-minute video explains!



Whilst still rooted in this work, London Rhymes has now developed into a collective of musicians, songs and projects, with a growing collection of over 40 original songs, a YouTube channel (which amassed 100K views in the first week of launching) and a live show, performed by our incredible band and led by singer and music leader Rosie Adediran.

Our Music:

With titles such as 'It's Nappy Time' and 'Let's be Friends', the songs are rooted in real-life parenting – the joys and the challenges – allowing families to listen to great music and inspiring them to use singing and music in their everyday lives.

Our eclectic, fun, upbeat sound has been inspired by the families that helped us write these songs, reflecting the diversity of London. From folk, jazz, Latin, blues and pop, marching songs and chants – the chances are we've got it in our repertoire! The band are highly experienced and inspiring performers/composers in their own right and all have a background in community arts – perfectly combining artistry with an ability to get the crowd going!

The Band:

Rosie Adediran is an established singer, songwriter and music leader, and is the founder and leader of London Rhymes. She loves working with parents and their small people, creating beautiful new songs and sounds and has led projects for a host of organisations such as the London Philharmonic Orchestra, the Royal College of Music, the Southbank Centre and many more. Rosie is also a Mum to a lively 3-year-old boy called Otis. She loves pickled onions. In fact, all things pickled!

Raph Clarkson is a trombonist, composer and workshop leader – he has played in bands all over the world, runs his ensembles The Dissolute Society, RESOLUTE, Speckles Brass and Equal Spirits, and has been commissioned to write a variety of pieces and arrangements including songs for young voices and orchestra (Sinfonia Viva). Raph enjoys the strange solitude of a solo cinema trip, where he can switch off from the world and also treat himself to popcorn and far too many sweets...





Jessie Grimes is an Irish clarinettist who also plays flute, ukulele and guitar...but hasn't quite mastered how to do them all at the same time! When she's not playing with orchestras, chamber groups, leading wacky musical workshops or telling musical stories on BBC Radio 3, Jessie loves getting her fingers mucky in the garden and dreams of growing courgettes bigger than watermelons!



Rosanna Ter-Berg performs the flute in many guises across the globe; from major concert venues to underground caves and live on radio. She is in demand as a soloist, improviser, session musician, chamber and orchestral musician, workshop leader and she was the Alternate Musical Director of The Globe's transfer of Emilia to London's West-End. She also works on stage as an actor and puppeteer too!



Rosie Bergonzi is a percussionist, classically trained at The Guildhall, but now mainly playing a variety of hand percussion. She's currently touring with singer Neneh Cherry. Notable performing highlights include a production of *Richard II* at The Globe and a BBC Prom with Chineke! Orchestra. Additionally, she works as a workshop leader with organisations such as The Wigmore Hall, ENO, Britten Sinfonia and The Southbank Centre. In her spare time, she likes to do karate and improvised comedy.



Rebekah Reid is a concert violinist specialising in classical and jazz repertoire, improvisation and composition who performs regularly as a classical soloist, chamber and orchestral musician in the UK and abroad. She has played in several British and European orchestras with concerts in prestigious venues such as the Queen Elizabeth Hall, Buckingham Palace and Suntory Hall in Japan. She is lead violinist in The Untold Orchestra and a member of 10 piece jazz ensemble The Forgotten Fairground. She also loves to go out dancing!
